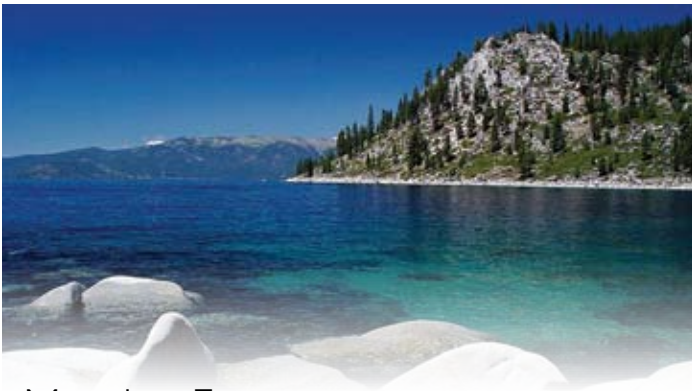

Guided Wildflower Hike - This hike begins on Tahoe's pristine northeast shore just minutes from the Hyatt. The main portion of our trail isn't on a map—yet is over 100 years old. It is a well-kept secret and a favorite of locals. The trail was built in the mid-1800's during the logging boom in the Tahoe area. The trail was used as a feeder flume to carry logs from the Tahoe Basin all the way down into Nevada to support the largest silver mine in the country. 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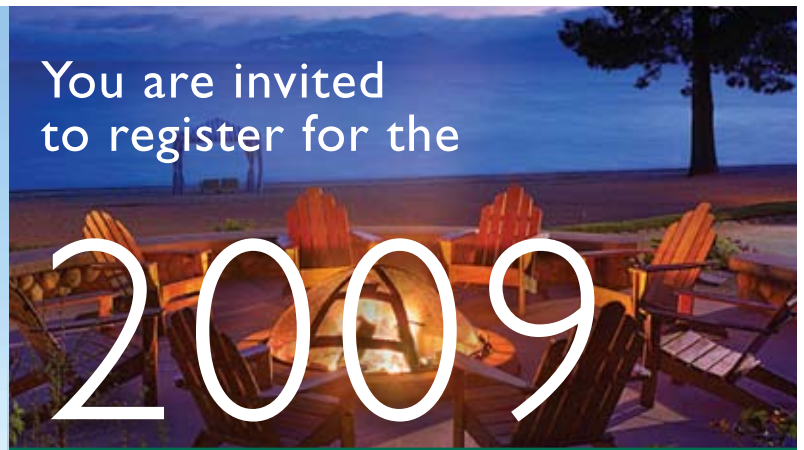
